## Additional Opportunities

- Free club for every PP child
- Daily paired reading for PP children in Y6
- Free places for targeted children for clubs from outside providers e.g. drama and Teddy Tennis
- RWI provision embedded into daily practice small group daily sessions for target children

- Organisation of staff: TA allocation in each class allowing small group support for Pupil Premium children and class based intervention groups. Allocation reviewed at half termly progress meetings.
- Occupational Therapy intervention access to support and training and advice for staff through specialist TA
- Speech and Language Intervention access to support and training and advice for staff through specialist TA
- Volunteer support for regularly hearing children read targeted at PP children

#### Monitoring

The impact of PPG expenditure is measured through:

- Data analysis Tracking attainment and progress
- Analysis of Pupil Attitudes to Self and School (PASS) survey and other pupil voice activities
- Tracking of behaviour incidents
- Regular progress meetings with class teachers

#### Impact

(APS = Average Point Score)

- Progress of Pupil Premium children in Year 2 ranged from 4 4.7APS in reading, writing and maths.
- Attainment at the end of KS1 (cohort of 16 PP children and 40 non PP children)

81% of Pupil Premium children achieved L2 and 13% achieved L3 in Reading (Higher than non PP at L2)

75% of Pupil Premium children achieved L2 and 14% achieved L5 in Writing (Equal to non PP at L2 and broadly in line at L3).

88% of Pupil Premium children achieved L2 and 30% achieved L3 in Maths (Higher than non PP at L2).

• Attainment at the end of KS2 (cohort of 20 PP children and 18 non PP children):

85% of Pupil Premium children achieved L4 and 35% achieved L5 in Reading (improvement on 2013-14 at L4 and L5)

70% of Pupil Premium children achieved L4 and 5% achieved L5 in Writing (improvement on 2013-14 at L4 and L5).

70% of Pupil Premium children achieved L4 and 30% achieved L5 in SPAG.

75% of Pupil Premium children achieved L4 and 25% achieved L5 in Maths (improvement on 2013-14 at L4).

 Progress of the 20 Pupil Premium children at the end of KS2, from KS1, exceeded National expectation of 12APS. *Reading 15.8APS* Writing 15.5APS

### Evaluation and forward planning for 2014-15

- Pupil conferencing for PP children making slow progress (from Summer 2014) or who have the potential to achieve higher levels but are not yet demonstrating it.
- Provision of weekly family support sessions.
