Unfortunately, this means that Years 5 and 6 will not be swimming at all this term. Years 1 and 2 are due to start swimming after Easter, but this will depend if the centre is re-opened. Playground Works

Mrs Williamson has been working hard with our external Project Manager on the next phase of development. ParentPay

As you know, the school uses ParentPay to collect money for school lunches, trips, and extras like DVDs. It is also used to gather volunteers and consent for trips, even if there is no payment due. Just a reminder that you can pay any amount of the total due, so small amounts can be paid towards a cost if you do not want to pay the whole amount at once. We do ask for full payment to be received by a given date as we need to use this money to pay for tickets and coaches. Please speak to the office if you have any problems with ParentPay. Mobile Phone Recycling

All profits from the campaign will go to the Mayor's Charitable Trust, which helps two amazing local causes - Kingston Centre for Independent Living and Oxygen, a charity for young people's mental health and well-being.

Parking

Please be considerate when parking at drop off and pick up times. There has been some dangerous parking recently on the corner of Dawson Road, which has nearly caused an accident with our



children. This area has double yellow lines which mean it is not permitted to park there at any time. Please park legally a bit further away and walk into school. We have previously mentioned the issue of leaving engines idling whilst waiting, which is toxic and dangerous. Please turn your engine off. Thank you.

Healthy Snacks

Children are encouraged to bring a healthy snack to eat at breaktime. However, some are not as healthy as they appear. For example, Kellogg's Fruit Winders Doubles contain 37% sugar, and Fruit Bowl apple and strawberry fruit flakes contain 69%



sugar; that's five times the amount of sugar found in fresh fruit, but with far lower levels of vitamins, minerals, water and enzymes that are all important for good health. Please only bring actual pieces of fruit for playtime snacks. Thank you.

Rotakids recently visited the Teddington Lifeboat Station as RNLI is their chosen charity this year. They had a wonderful time learning about the charity, all


about how the station works, and, of course, they had to get into the vehicles and try on the outfits for themselves! Thank you to John Cannon from the Rotary Club for arranging the trip.





Random Acts of Kindness

At the end of the Autumn term, the School Council evaluated and revised our Random Acts of Kindness. Miss Newton recently launched the new Random Acts of Kindness in assembly:



We use a very useful memory technique to remember them all. The images above are visualised on ten different parts of your body. The images are linked to the acts. This system can be used to learn absolutely anything! We aim to do at least one Random Act of Kindness each day.

This is how we remember them:

1. On your head: a yellow waving hand

2. In your ear: a blue question mark around an orange person

3. On your nose: a laughing face

4. In your mouth: a speech bubble with a heart inside

On your shoulder: a person sitting on their ownAround your waist: a rainbow queue of people

7. Between your knees: a sad face with a bumped head

8. Under your feet: a giant pencil

9. On your left palm: two stick people doing a high-5 10. On your right palm: a mini broom and dustpan



You can help your child remember these by asking:

"What's on your head?"

"What are you standing on?"

"What's around your waist?"
