Although payments requested are voluntary contributions, if we are unable to secure funds to cover the costs of any trip it may have to be cancelled. We rely on volunteers who have a Barred List Check or DBS though the school to accompany trips, and are very grateful to those who help in this way. 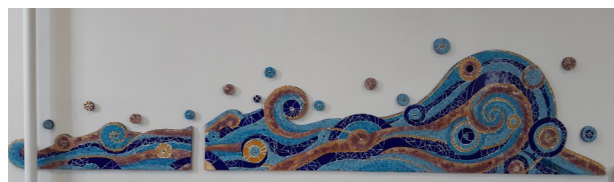

Clothing and Shoes in EYFS/KS1

Please ensure that your child comes to Nursery wearing clothing and shoes which they can manage themselves. Lace-up shoes and difficult buttons or zips are not helpful, and the staff spend a lot of time sorting them out! Slip-on or Velcro shoes are ideal for Early Years and KS1 until they can move on to more difficult fastenings. However, practising with buttons, zips and laces is a really good idea for an activity to do at home.
