We will be

- Responding to significant experiences during circle time
- Developing our understanding of the golden rules of the classroom
- We will begin to have assemblies on how to be a good role model

At Home:

• Talk about how you are feeling e.g. when you are must happy, when you are sad and what you can do to help (cuddle a bear/talk to an adult)

Mathematics

We will be

- Exploring numbers to 10 in greater depth
- We will use the mastery approach of focusing on a number each week; finding ways to make the number and counting objects of that amount

At Home:

- Look for numbers in the world around you, spot numbers on doors and buses
- Play some board games using dice to help with number recognition

Understanding the World

We will be

- Performing a Christmas Nativity
- Learning and participating in different celebrations
- Developing an awareness of, and an interest in, cultural and religious differences

At Home:

- Talk about what you celebrate within your family
- Bring in a photo or memorable object of a festival/special day that you have celebrated

Expressive Arts & Design

We will be

- Making Christmas cards
- Using clay to create diva lamps for Divali
- Making patterned wrapping paper for our Christmas presents!
