<u>Extra-Curricular Clubs – Spring Term 2024</u>

This letter contains all of the information you need to know about our Spring term clubs, including a timetable and menu of what is available.

Application Process

- The Extra Curricular Clubs Application Google form link will arrive in your inbox on Sunday 3rd December at 10:00am and will close on Tuesday 5th December at 7:00am.
- Clubs are requested by indicating preferences via the Google form.
- Clubs are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Google Forms will process the applications according to the date/time they are received. Please do not assume you were successful even if you submitted your form at the point of opening.
- Paid-for places if your child is successful in gaining a place, you will see a new payment item on your ParentPay account. Your child's place is only considered booked once you have made the full payment.
- Free places under the Pupil Premium scheme (PP) these will be confirmed <u>via email</u> to families
 individually and <u>will not</u> appear on ParentPay. Any child who is eligible for Pupil Premium funding
 is entitled to <u>one free</u> club. If more than one club is requested, additional clubs will need to be
 paid for via ParentPay.

Clubs Rationale

Our aim is to offer at least one club to every child who applies, in the order that we receive the applications. We have always felt this is the fairest way to distribute places. If you selected more than one club, it does not mean you will be successful in being allocated more than one. If the club you have selected is full, your child will be put on a waiting list and given a place if one becomes available.

Payment Concerns

If you feel you cannot make the payment by the specified deadline, then please email the school office and mark it for the attention of 'Natali O'Farrell/Darren Mc Laughlin'. We understand the Christmas/Holiday period can be a challenging time for some families. We will contact you to work out how we can best support you.







<u>Y3-Y6 Choir Club</u>

Mr Thomas is looking forward to continuing the Choir Club in the Spring term. As stated in the Autumn clubs' letter, the Choir will be performing later in the academic year so it is important that the children who signed up last term **commit for the whole academic year**. Subject to availability, we may not be able to offer your child a second or third club place.

Reception Clubs

We are delighted to inform you that we are now able to offer six sport and non-sport clubs for children in Reception classes (Nelson and Kusama).

New clubs/School Council Feedback

We are delighted to offer a wider range of clubs for Spring 2024. The School Council have helped us decide on new club providers.

Sports Clubs - what to wear

If your child has a sports club on a day that they do not have PE, they should come dressed in their PE uniform (and not wear school uniform). This means they will be appropriately dressed and ready to start their club either before or after school.

<u>Snacks</u>

Children are allowed to bring a small healthy snack (no nuts) on a club day. They can have this before their clubs starts.

Pupil Premium (PP) Places (25% + places available)

Each PP-eligible child is entitled to one free club per term. Pupil Premium funding is allocated to children who are entitled to Free School Meals (not universal free school meals for R-Y6) or those who have been entitled during the past six years. Please apply for club places on the Google form and indicate if your child comes under our PP scheme.

Spring 2024 - Sports Clubs Available:

Football: Monday Y5-Y6 (Mixed Football), Tuesday Y3-Y6 (Girls only*), Wednesday YR-Y2, Thursday Y1-Y2, Friday Y3-Y4, Kick it Soccer (External Provider)

Children are given the opportunities to learn skills such as dribbling, passing and shooting. They will also take part in a full range of drills specifically designed for their level and ability. They are taught how to participate as a member of a team in competitive games which develops their confidence and communication skills.

*Girls' Football - We are supporting the Football Association's ambition to give girls equal access to football by 2024. This is a great opportunity for the girls to excel in football, they will be able to take part in a range of drills and small/larger sized games.

Gymnastics: Tuesday YR-Y2, Friday - Y3-Y6 - Good Life Gymnastics (External Provider)

The children will develop movement and balance skills enabling them to become increasingly competent and confident. They will be able to develop sequences individually and in groups. We have a wide range of resources which will support the children's development and progress.

Dance: Wednesday YR-Y2 - Boo Theatre Entertainment (External Provider)

Boo Theatre Entertainment is delivering this new club for Spring 2024. The children will have the opportunity to perform dances using a range of movement patterns. They will learn different styles including street dance and musical theatre. The classes will be fun and engaging

Martial Arts: Thursday Y2-Y5 - International Coaching Ltd (External Provider)

This new and exciting club is launching in Spring 2024. The children will be taught basic martial art moves including blocks, punches and kicks. The club will develop the children's competence, confidence and discipline.

Tennis: Friday Y3-Y6 - Kick it Soccer (External Provider) (AM club)

Children are given the opportunity to refine their skills and take part in a full range of drills specifically designed for their level and ability. They are taught how to participate in both singles and doubles matches.



Spring 2024 - Non-Sports Clubs Available:

Drama: Monday YR-Y2, Boo Theatre Entertainment (External Provider)

This popular drama club returns with our new provider, Boo Theatre Entertainment. The classes will develop the children's creativity, public speaking, teamwork, reading and performance. They will have the opportunity to practice both small and large group performances.

Gardening: Monday Y3-Y6, Staff and Parent/Carer Volunteers (Internal)

This new club launched in Autumn 2 with the School Council and other selected children. It proved a real success. We are delighted it is now part of our clubs menu for Spring 2024. In this club the children will learn how to grow vegetable as well as plan and look after a garden. They will also look at the importance of plants and wildlife in the context of an eco-system.

Arts and Crafts: Tuesday V3-V6, Friday VR-V2, The Arts and Crafts (External Provider)

These exciting new clubs will strive to harness the natural creativity and imagination of children to make mini masterpieces. Using a variety of mediums, household materials and objects from nature children will make prints, self-portraits, snow globes, spring bouquets, wall hangings and much more. The clubs will encourage them to be creative both individually and in groups.

Cooking: Wednesday Y3-Y5, Thursday YR-Y2 WilsonJones (External Provider)

This club returns for the Spring term. The children will learn how to cook using a variety of recipes. They will be able to prepare, cook and taste a wide range of foods from different countries. The two instructors are fully qualified to deliver these sessions and we are delighted that these sessions are provided by our trusted school meals provider, WilsonJones. Chess: Wednesday Y3-Y6 - Chess in Schools and the Community (External Provider)

This club is an ideal opportunity for your child to develop their strategic skills. They will learn the basic rules and compete against each other on a weekly basis. The children will be grouped according to their level/age.

Choir: Thursday Y3-Y6 - Mr Samuel Thomas

Does your child like singing? Would they like to be involved in an energetic club with performance opportunities? King Athelstan has always had an active choir. Children will take part in performances both within school and in the local community.
