- Work can be presented in a variety of ways. In the past we have had video and audio clips as well as items on paper and 3D models.
 - Please note that all video or audio clips need to be uploaded to Google Classroom.
- Each piece of work will receive recognition from the class teacher.
- End of term "Thinker's Project" exhibition: This will be held at the end of every term and is an opportunity to celebrate the work that has been completed. At least one piece of completed "Thinker's Project" work from every child will be on show at the exhibition.

This term, the exhibition will take place in the large hall on Wednesday 27th March from 3:20pm to 3:50pm and again from 5:30pm to 6:00pm. Please come along and help us celebrate your child's amazing contributions.
