League Tables

Many of you will have seen the recently published school league tables. A number of parents/carers have asked for more information about these. We are currently ranked fourth in Kingston on overall progress. This means that children make excellent progress from their various starting points. For some children this might be starting at our school either at or above age related expectations and leaving above or significantly above age related expectations. For others, who start at our school significantly below expectations, progress might be to National Expectations or just below.

You will note that combined attainment (Reading, Writing and Maths) is at 65%, which is the current Government Floor target. This is because, although Year 6 cohort made exceptional progress last year, 35% of them did not achieve a level 4 in all 3 areas that are measured by the Government. Have a look at the attainment and progress information below to understand more.

100% of our cohort achieved expected progress in reading and writing, 52% exceeding this in reading. Schools with lower Contextual Value Added might have achieved higher standards, however the children may not have made as much progress.

How can you help us to continue to raise standards?

- Continue to read with your child/children every day
- Support opportunities to write for a purpose as often as possible! e.g. Shopping lists, messages, thank you letters writing stories for younger siblings/cousins/friends etc.
- Use IXL and maths passports to help children's mental maths learning
- Consistently correct you child's spoken grammar e.g. "We were" not "we was" and also correct tenses e.g. correcting "Yesterday I <u>run</u> down the road" to "Yesterday I <u>ran</u> down the road".

Reading Reward Scheme

We are always looking to encourage children to engage in their reading outside of school. In the last few weeks of this term we have trialed a home reading reward scheme that aims to increase the amount of reading that is taking place at home. It involves teachers and TAs monitoring your child's home reading on a daily basis. If their reading book has been signed then they receive a tick that counts toward a reward. While it is preferable that a parent or carer signs their book, we are aware that this is not always possible and therefore children from year 2 upwards are allowed to sign themselves. The scheme has resulted in an increase in home reading across the school and will be implemented

from year 1-6 after the Christmas break.
