As such, revised guidelines will be issued before the end of term that will be in place for the Spring term.

Attendance

We have continued to have a lot of questions about attendance letters. Thank you for your ongoing feedback. Please be assured that we do not mean to offend parents and carers with our letters. The Government change from 85% to 90% attendance could trigger Education Welfare Officer involvement for many more families than previously and it is important that we update you regularly on your child's attendance. As a school, we are held to account by Governors, the Local Authority and the Government for our attendance data and therefore we must monitor it carefully and work with families to remove barriers to attendance.

We all know that children who are in school every day (apart from when they are too unwell to attend) have a better chance to succeed than those who regularly have time off. We know that, as parents and carers, you feel strongly about this too. Being unwell is unavoidable, however, some children have time off for very minor illnesses or take holidays in term time or are absent without reason. In all cases, we do need to let you know when attendance drops below 90%. If you feel absence has been incorrectly recorded then please speak to Mrs Abdool in the school office - we can easily rectify this and we are happy to chat to you about individual attendance issues or queries.
