<u>Updates</u>

Attendance - From September 2015 the level that is considered Persistently Absent (PA) will be increased to 90% (previously 85%). This means that if a child's attendance falls below 90% the Local Authority will be informed and external Education Welfare Officers may become involved. Please do not book holidays in term time. Absences due to holidays taken during school time could hinder academic progress and will not be authorised by the school. Without school's permission, such absences are treated as truancy and may lead to parental prosecution. If your child is away for extended periods, they risk losing their school place. Children <u>MUST</u> return on time after holiday periods and not leave early before holidays.

Healthy Eating

As you are aware our school caterers are changing for the new academic year. We see this as an opportunity to continue promoting healthy eating in the school. The PCSA have kindly agreed to fund the fruit and vegetable snacks for the whole of KS2 during our first week back.
