Building Work

Like us, many of you have been eagerly waiting for the building project to start. Some families, who are newer to the school, are possibly wondering what we are all talking about! The final plans will soon be available on our website. The work will provide a much needed 2 storey permanent extension to the school so that all classes will be in the main building. It will also provide some space for group work as well as additional toilets and refurbished nursery toilets and staffroom.

Eventually, when you walk down the Reception class/Year 3 corridor that leads to the halls, there will be classrooms on both sides. Year 2 will be downstairs and Year 6 upstairs.

Over the past 12 years, the school has grown from 165 pupils to 420 so we really need the space. The school is remaining 2 form entry but will be able to comfortably accommodate everyone in the building and remove demountables. Exciting times ahead! We are very grateful to a parent who has managed to obtain a response from the Environment Agency (EA) regarding the "midge" flies that inconvenience our site. They answered that, although frustrating, the flies pose no health risk. School Governor, Mr Dave Ryder-Mills, has had a meeting with Thames Water and an EA official to discuss the flies. As a result of both conversations, the organisations now appear to be taking serious interest in the situation and have offered to work with parents/carers to find a solution.
