## <u>Parking</u>

Please can parents and carers avoid parking over driveways/on the corners of Dawson Road when picking up or dropping off. Our school is situated on a busy road and it is important that parents and carers set a good example of road safety for their child/ren. We have had a number of complaints from our neighbours who have not been able to get in and out of their own driveways because of illegal parking. Please allow five minutes extra so that you can park safely or further away and walk safely into school. #### <u>"ParentPay"</u>

Please ensure that you activate your "ParentPay" account as soon as possible, if you have not already done so. You will need this even if you are using PayPoints. "ParentPay" will be used from April 1<sup>st</sup> 2016 for all school meal bookings. The school office will no longer take bookings for school meals, including menu selections. **If you do not register and book your child's meals online they will not be able to have a school meal**. If you need help with this or access to the internet, please speak to the school office and we will support this process. You need to register even if your child does not currently have school meals as we will be adding trips and clubs at a later date. <u>**All**</u> parents/carers <u>must</u> register.

## Support in Year 2

If your child is in Year 2, they may have mentioned that Mr Chandler and Mr Porter have been in their classes a lot! This is because we recognise the challenge of the new end of year expectations and we want to support children as they progress towards them. These members of the Leadership Team will be in core lessons working alongside our fantastic class teachers to ensure all children are challenged and supported to make good progress.

## Learning Pit

In a recent assembly we discussed how we learn and our attitudes towards learning. A helpful way that was used to help the children understand their learning was "The Learning Pit." The analogy is, that if you are going through your learning and everything is really easy (i.e. you are walking on flat ground) you are not being challenged! When you are met with a challenge and it is hard, you feel like you have fallen into the "pit" and can't climb out. Learning is tricky and your brain needs to work hard to achieve success. This is good! "The Learning Pit" analogy explains that the best learning happens in the bottom of the pit, when your mind is full of questions. Slowly as you "climb" your way out of the "pit" you will reach a full understanding. "The Learning Pit" in its more simplified version is the "Learning Line" which children are beginning to understand well. Please use this analogy at home when doing homework as a way to help children see challenge as a positive aspect to learning. Remember you do all your best learning when you are in the "pit."



Try and go into the Learning Pit every day!
