O'Keeffe class has been working hard on a whole school approach to Building Learning Power. To ensure that it is accessible to children in all year groups, they devised a new acronym:

- P = Perseverance
- R = Respect (for own learning and others)
- I = Imagination
- D = Delving deep
- E = Excellence

They decided on an animal for each learning skill, based on their behavior:

For perseverance, the honey badger, as these determined animals show that if you "try, try, try, then you can, can, can." For Respect, the wolf; these majestic creatures work in closely-knit teams. "For the strength of the Pack is the Wolf, and the strength of the Wolf is the Pack" (Rudyard Kipling). For Imagination, the unique chameleon. It creatively adapts to its environment to approach each situation differently - this will remind us to think "outside of the box" in our learning. For Delving Deep, the intelligence of the dolphin was recognised - we want to be learners who "think about thinking" and ask how we get to answers, as well as going "above and beyond" to explore learning further. Finally, when all of these skills are put to use, we will strive for Excellence and always do the best we can. The lion, as part of a Pride and the "King of the Jungle", was the obvious choice as an animal respected and admired.
