

Little League Football - New Malden Little League Football will be holding trials to give the opportunity for players, both boys and girls, to either join the League or move up from the Junior Section to the Senior Section. Trials will be held at Manor Park in New Malden at 09:30 to 11:00 on

Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May, Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> May and Saturday 20th May for children born between 01/09/2010 and 31/08/2016 who are eligible to play in the 23/24 season. Players wishing

to attend should wear football boots and shin pads with any suitable sportswear. The trials are free. If selected, the annual fee to play the whole season is £40. Following trials, the League will organise players into Teams and the League plans to commence late September.
