The children had been practising a range of songs to mark this moment in history. The songs focussed on being together, supporting

entertain and commemorate this momentous day for the country that will go down in history.


### Message from Kingston University

Kingston University has informed us that they are undertaking a site survey at the Middle Mill site as part of their estate management. The survey encompasses the Middle Mill halls of residence estate and the adjacent parts of the Hogsmill river only. Surveyors will be on location until 12 May. They will be using a tripod and scanner, measuring river depths, and using a drone to provide an aerial survey of the site. They wanted to reassure neighbours that the drone scan does not show any moving objects, including people or cars.
