#### National Three Peaks Challenge

Today, five staff members (Kayleigh Lee, Barbara Favretti, Ceris Heath, Roz Coelho and Darren Mc Laughlin) have travelled to Scotland to start their gruelling challenge of walking up and down the highest mountains in

Scotland, England and Wales within 24 hours, all to raise money for the school! Money raised will go towards the Big Outdoors Project to renovate the KS1 playground.



- -Ben Nevis 1345m, this is the highest mountain
- -Scafell Pike 978m, a Saturday evening climb
- -Snowdon 1085m, 4:30am climb on the Sunday



The children have attended an assembly about the Three Peaks so they are aware of the challenge. Many of you sponsored the team last year, when the attempt had to be abandoned due to an issue with the company's transport, and we are very grateful for your support. #### Language Learners

On Tuesday we were visited by 16 Year 10 students from Kingston Grammar School who had planned short language lessons for children in Years 3-6. Over the afternoon



they delivered lessons in German, Chinese, French, Spanish and Italian to various classes. The children enjoyed learning new words (and practising their French which Mme Bailey has taught them!), and the KGS students also enjoyed the experience of passing on their language skills.



#### Safeguarding - Online Platforms

As always, we would like to remind parents/carers to carefully monitor the content their children access on the internet and via gaming platforms. The internet and online games can provide great opportunities for learning and socialising, as part of a balanced range of activities, but also comes with significant risks. This is something we manage frequently in school (e.g. children accessing inappropriate content, online bullying) and comes up consistently in safeguarding training and bulletins for staff. There is a helpful checklist here:

One, very popular, gaming platform that is raised regularly is Roblox - an online gaming platform where you can play games designed by other users and create your own games. There is no minimum age specification for Roblox but the platform is aimed at ages 13+. The main risks associated with Roblox are accessing games

with inappropriate (sexual, violent, horror) content, those that encourage dangerous behaviours (e.g. selfharm) and the chat/forum functions. You can find out how to set parental controls on Roblox here: https://en.help.roblox.com/hc/en-us/articles/360000375686-Account-Restrictions.

These allow you to limit interactions and the types of games your children can play. However, even with these in place, we recommend regularly monitoring what your child accesses as users with less-than-good intentions often find ways to bypass these controls. Thank you for your support.

400 minutes of reading




In one month:
