## FUEL: Summer 2023 Holiday Activity and Food programme - bookings open!

Bookings have opened for the Summer 2023 FUEL Holiday Activity and Food programme!



FUEL provides free activities and food for children whose parents are eligible for benefits- related Free School Meals during the Easter, Summer and Winter school holidays. If your child is eligible, you should have a 17 digit FUEL

code. If you think your child may be eligible but you haven't got a

code, email the FUEL team at: <u>fuel@achievingforchildren.org.uk</u> or ask at the school office. If you have your code, you can book on to sessions



### To take part at the library:

- Visit your local library and tell them you would like to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge
- The library will get you signed up and will give you a special collector folder
- Your child will set a personal reading goal for the summer (we recommend six books)
- Your child can borrow and read books, e-Books and audiobooks of their choice. They can read anything they like: fiction, fact books, poetry, joke books, picture books and graphic novels all count towards completing the Challenge!
- The library will provide fun reading activities and special incentives along the way
- Your child will receive a certificate for taking part, or for reaching their Challenge goal
- In addition, many libraries offer a wide variety of events and activities for families to enjoy throughout the summer
