We are lucky enough to have teamed up with the Hogsmill Community Garden and now have two keen gardeners, Pip and Brian, as well as Caitlin who is a parent from King Athelstan, helping us out on a regular basis. The beds had become depleted and the soil dry and unproductive so the team have cleared most of the beds and added compost with the help of the Year 2 children.

They have also added seaweed! Over the summer we hope to sow some special 'green manure' plants which will grow within the beds over the colder autumn months and then be dug into the beds to replenish them ready for planting next spring. There are a number of plans to get the children out and interacting with the allotment in the next few months and we look forward to updating you in September.

# Uniform Reminders

A reminder that our uniform policy states the following regarding children wearing watches to school: "Children are permitted to wear discrete watches to school, provided these can be removed independently for PE. We encourage the use of analogue 'teaching' style watches to support children learning to tell the time. Simple digital watches are permitted, provided they do not make any sounds, however smart watches that connect to other devices or have interactive features (e.g. sending/receiving messages or calls) are not allowed in school."



If children bring a smart watch to school they will be asked to hand this in as per our mobile phone policy and will be asked not to wear it again. Smart watches present a safeguarding risk as well as a distraction and are not necessary in school. Thank you for your support with this.

Please ensure all items are named, including water bottles as children often have the same ones.

# ADHD Embrace

ADHD Embrace will be running a Parenting Course in September aimed at parents of Primary School aged children. This course is subsidised for Richmond Borough parents by Richmond Voluntary Fund. Led by Noël Janis-

Norton, parenting author, speaker, and consultant, Director of 'Calmer, Easier, Happier Parenting', this course is specifically designed for parents of primary-age children with ADHD and related neuro-developmental issues. It will help parents understand the causes and contributing factors when a child is struggling with behaviour, learning or social skills. Noël will explain the benefits of a positive, firm and consistent approach to help parents with the 'Big Five' goals that parents of ADHD children often ask for advice about cooperation, confidence, motivation, self-reliance, and consideration. In each session, Noël will introduce and explain one or more practical and effective strategies, followed by time for Q&A.

Sessions will address the following:

Children with an extreme temperament: very sensitive, intense, impulsive, inflexible, and who often show a discrepancy between above-average cognitive ability and immature social or emotional development, rudeness, verbal and/or physical aggression, below-average receptive and/or expressive language, sibling rivalry and jealousy. Routines: mornings, mealtimes, homework, sibling relationships, peer relationships, screen time, independent play, homework, bedtimes. Parents/carers will be provided with templates, summary pages, and planning pages to support putting new strategies into practice in between the weekly sessions. Parents/carers will also be sent links to videos, podcasts, ebooks, and articles that give more information about the 'Calmer, Easier, Happier Parenting' principles. **Dates: Wednesday evenings** from 8:00 pm to 9.30 pm for six weeks: September 13, 20, 27, October 4, 11, 18. <u>Register Now</u>
