Harvest Collection



Thank you so much for all the donations left earlier this week which we have given to the Kingston Foodbank. The photo (left) is just a small sample of the items given. There was a bumper collection of 28 bags full of all sorts of dried foods and tins as well as toiletries and cleaning products which will be handed out to support families in Kingston.

Voluntary Payments

Thank you to those families who have made voluntary payments in the 'Donate the cost of a lunch' item on ParentPay. So far, an amazing £307.40 has been raised! Our works over the summer in the main school kitchen cost us £530, so your donations will go towards maintaining all the specialist kitchen equipment including the steam oven, the large dishwasher, the fridges and the freezers.

The 'Donation to the school fund for resources' has received £660 this term so far. To give an idea of costs to the school, we have just spent £951.55 on a paper order (A3 and A4). We also bought the same volume of paper in May 2023. Your donations will go towards the costs of the pallet of paper.

Families also donate to the 'voluntary overpayment for trips' and each year group benefits from any money paid in to support the costs of their trips. Thank you so much.

World Mental Health Day

On Tuesday 10th October, we will be celebrating World Mental Health Day in school, as we do each year. We will be teaching the children the importance of looking after our mental health. Children may wear green accessories (hair bows, socks, head bands, etc.) along with their usual school/PE uniform. The theme for this year is: 'Care to Share'. We will be exploring and teaching children that sharing is an important skill



to learn and practise as it helps us make friends, become better learners and live a happier life. We will be sharing a toy and book giveaway at the end of the day where children can take an item home to share with their family. We will also be raising money for the redevelopment of the KS1 playground as this is a space that our children love to share. Nasal Flu Immunisation

The immunisation is a painless nasal spray, available for all children from Reception to Year 6, and will take place at school on **Wednesday 1st November** during the school day. **Parents/cares must give consent by 30/10/23 for their child to be included**. The NHS highly recommend that all children receive the vaccination to protect them against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia.




Year 5 Dragons!

The aim is for them to recall these facts instantly. It is expected that the children will learn and practise these in school AND at home. Home Start provides a vital lifeline for local families with children under five. At the heart of this local charity are the parent volunteers who give their time to help other parents who are struggling to cope. They support them to manage their own issues as well as helping their pre-school children to be ready for nursery and school.

Last year they helped 286 vulnerable families and 476 children in the boroughs of Kingston, Richmond and Hounslow; most being referred by Health Visitors and other professionals. The trained volunteers support parents with difficulties such as mental health, family breakdown, domestic abuse, bereavement, disability or a combination of factors that can affect their children's welfare.
