Royal Academy of Arts - Young Artists Summer show - Taking inspiration from the <u>Summer Exhibition</u>, the Young Artists' Summer Show is a free, open submission exhibition for young artists aged 4-19 years studying in the UK.



Submitting artwork is completely free and must be done online by Easter. Once the school is registered, artwork can be submitted. If you're 12 or under, a parent/guardian will need to enter for you. Each student can submit one artwork and there is no theme. Each entrant will be asked for an image of the artwork plus some information about the piece such as title, size, and a little text about the artwork and why it was made. The artwork will be seen by a <u>panel of judges</u> and the selected pieces will be shown in the online exhibition. Some of the artworks will also be shown at the Royal
