## SEND Support Plan Meetings

Families of children with SEND Support Plans will have meetings with their teachers this term <u>in-person</u> to review your child's provision on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> June from 3.30-4:30 or Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> June from 4.00-5:30. Appointments will last <u>10 minutes</u>. Look out for the letter in emails, with details of how to book.

# Trips/Visits

Please remember that we need your consent to take your child on the exciting trips we plan every term. The only exception to this is if it is a local trip in Kingston as every family agreed to local permissions when they started school.

We usually need extra adults to accompany trips and are so grateful to parents and carers who volunteer to come. All volunteers need to have a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check and be able to produce an indate DBS certificate. You can apply for a DBS via our website <a href="here">here</a>. Each application costs the school £15 so we ask applicants to pay for it (or part of it) if possible via ParentPay under 'DBS Check for Volunteers - Voluntary Item'.

Many, but not all, trips and visits have a cost for a coach, an entrance fee or workshop. We divide the whole cost by the number of children attending and ask families to pay their portion. We recognise that extra costs are difficult for some families, and so have the option to overpay (on ParentPay) for those who wish to do this. It is a very generous action and we are very grateful to families who do this as it helps to ensure that no trip or visit is cancelled due to lack of funds.

All letters notifying parents of upcoming trips and visits are sent via email, so make sure the office always has your correct address/es. All event letters are also put onto the school website for information <a href="here">here</a>. We use ParentPay to collate all trip information, even if there is no cost involved. On ParentPay you will be asked to give consent, pay if there is a cost, offer to be a volunteer, and any other confirmations we might need for specific trips or events. Thank you.
