Extra-Curricular Clubs - Summer Term 2024

This letter contains all of the information you need to know about our Summer term clubs, including a timetable and menu of what is available.

You can see the full list of all available clubs below. All information related to Extra-Curricular Clubs can also be found on the school website here.

Application Process

- The Extra-Curricular Clubs Google Application Form link will arrive in your inbox on Sunday 17th March at 10:00am and will close on Tuesday 19th March at 7:00am.
- Clubs are requested by indicating preferences via the Google Application Form.
- Clubs are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Google Application Forms will process the applications according to the date/time they are received. Please do not assume you were successful even if you submitted your form at the point of opening.
- <u>Paid-for places -</u> if your child is successful in gaining a place, you will see a new payment item on your ParentPay account. Your child's place is only considered booked once you have made the full payment.
- Free places under the Pupil Premium scheme (PP) these will be confirmed via email to families
 individually and will not appear on ParentPay. Any child who is eligible for Pupil Premium funding
 is entitled to one free club. If more than one club is requested, additional clubs will need to be
 paid for via ParentPay.

Clubs Rationale

Our aim is to offer at least one club to every child who applies, in the order that we receive the applications. We have always felt this is the fairest way to distribute places. If you selected more than one club, it does not mean you will be successful in being allocated more than one. If the club you have selected is full, your child will be put on a waiting list and given a place if one becomes available.

Payment Concerns

If you feel you cannot make the payment by the specified deadline, then please email the school office and mark it for the attention of 'Natali O'Farrell/Darren Mc Laughlin'. We will contact you to work out how we can best support you.

Please note that prices reflect 10 weeks of clubs for the Summer term. The previous (Spring) term had 9 weeks of clubs. Therefore, there is one additional week of clubs in the Summer term.











Y3-Y6 Choir Club

Children already attending Choir Club

All children who currently attend Choir Club are automatically signed up for the club for the Summer term 2024. This counts as their first choice of club. If your child no longer wants to take part in the Choir Club, please email admin@kinqathelstan.rbksch.org by Tuesday 19th March to cancel their place.

If you have completed an Extra-Curricular Clubs Google Application Form for your child to take part in additional clubs for Summer 2024, we will let you if we have been able to offer a second/third club for your child. Places will be subject to availability.

Choir Club Waiting List

We are unlikely to have additional Choir Club places available in the Summer term. However, if your child would like to join Choir there is the option on the Google Application Form to join the Choir Club waiting list.

Sports Clubs - what to wear

If your child has a sports club on a day that they do not have PE, they should come dressed in their PE uniform (and not wear school uniform). This means they will be appropriately dressed and ready to start their club either before or after school.

Snacks

Children are allowed to bring a small healthy snack (no nuts) on a club day. They can have this before their clubs starts.

Pupil Premium (PP) Places (25% + places available)

Each PP-eligible child is entitled to one free club per term. Pupil Premium funding is allocated to children who are entitled to Free School Meals (not universal free school meals for R-Y6) or those who have been entitled during the past six years. Please apply for club places on the Google Application Form and indicate if your child comes under our PP scheme.

Summer 2024 - Sports Clubs Available

Cricket: Monday Y4-Y6, Friday Y3-Y4 - Kick it Soccer (External Provider)

Y3-Y4 and Y4-Y6 Football Clubs have changed to Cricket Club for the Summer term

In this new club for the Summer term the children are given the opportunity to learn key skills and take part in a full range of drills specifically designed for their level and ability. The children will learn how to throw, catch, field, bat, bowl and participate in mini-game situations.

Football: Tuesday Y3-Y6 (Girls only*), Wednesday YR-Y2, Thursday Y1-Y2 - Kick it Soccer (External Provider)

Children are given the opportunities to learn skills such as dribbling, passing and shooting. They will also take part in a full range of drills specifically designed for their level and ability. They are taught how to participate as a member of a team in competitive games which develops their confidence and communication skills.

*Girls' Football - We are supporting the Football Association's ambition to give girls equal access to football by 2024. This is a great opportunity for girls to excel in football, they will be able to take part in a range of drills and small/larger sized games.

Gymnastics: Tuesday YR-Y2, Friday - Y3-Y6 - Good Life Gymnastics (External Provider)

The children will develop movement and balance skills enabling them to become increasingly competent and confident. They will be able to develop sequences individually and in groups. We have a wide range of resources which will support the children's development and progress.

Dance: Wednesday YR-Y2 - Boo Theatre Entertainment (External Provider)

The children will have the opportunity to perform dances using a range of movement patterns. They will learn different styles including street dance and musical theatre. The classes will be fun and engaging.

Martial Arts: Thursday Y2-Y6 - International Coaching Ltd (External Provider)

The children will be taught basic martial art moves including blocks, punches and kicks. The club will develop the children's competence, confidence and discipline.

Tennis: Friday Y3-Y6 - Kick it Soccer (External Provider) (Morning club)

Children are given the opportunity to refine their skills and take part in a full range of drills specifically designed for their level and ability. They are taught how to participate in both singles and doubles matches.

Summer 2024 - Non-Sports Clubs Available

Drama: Monday YR-Y2, Boo Theatre Entertainment (External Provider)

The classes will develop the children's creativity, public speaking, teamwork, reading and performance. They will have the opportunity to practice both small and large group performances.

Gardening: Monday Y3-Y6, Parent/Carer Volunteers (Internal)

In this club the children will learn how to grow vegetable as well as plan and look after a garden. They will also look at the importance of plants and wildlife in the context of an eco-system.

Arts and Crafts: Tuesday Y3-Y6, Friday YR-Y2, The Arts and Crafts (External Provider)

Using a variety of mediums, household materials and objects from nature children will make prints, self-portraits, snow globes, spring bouquets, wall hangings and much more. The clubs will encourage them to be creative both individually and in groups.

Cooking: Wednesday Y3-Y6, Thursday YR-Y2 WilsonJones (External Provider)

The children will learn how to cook using a variety of recipes. They will be able to prepare, cook and taste a wide range of foods from different countries. The two instructors are fully qualified to deliver these sessions and we are delighted that these sessions are provided by our trusted school meals provider, WilsonJones.

Chess: Wednesday Y3-Y6 - Chess in Schools and the Community (External Provider)

This club is an ideal opportunity for your child to develop their strategic skills. They will learn the basic rules and compete against each other on a weekly basis. The children will be grouped according to their level/age.
