Uniform Reminder

Please note that school uniform includes black leather/ leather look school shoes. Trainers or black leather trainer-look footwear are not permitted except at play times. Children are not permitted to wear ankle/knee length boots. Children must wear their school shoes to and from school. Plain lilac, black or white hijabs are also considered part of the school uniform. Please note that leggings worn as trousers, or underneath skirts and dresses, are not permitted. Children may wear tights all year round instead. Children are only permitted to wear stud earrings if they are able to remove them or cover them independently for PE. No other jewellery is allowed, apart from religious items. We request hair accessories are kept to a minimum - discreet, small and unobtrusive hair bands/clips/scrunchies only are acceptable. Please note jojo bows and novelty hair bands, including cats' ear bands, are not permitted. Remember that <u>back packs/</u> ruck sacks are not permitted at school as we are not able to store them. Please do not give these to children, as they will be asked to take them home. Draw-string bags are ideal.
