Symptoms and Testing

You may be aware that COVID cases in Kingston are rising and are now double the London rate. Yesterday, we had 22 children across the school waiting for results of PCR tests. A number of these children came to school with symptoms and had to be sent home to get tests. Others have been kept at home with symptoms, however their siblings have been sent to school. This is putting others at risk of infection and isolation. The number is particularly high as the current advise is for the whole household to seek PCR tests when one member has symptoms and so some tests are for asymptomatic siblings.

The rules are very straightforward and we ask that all parents and carers take these seriously to protect the well-being of everyone within our school community.

If a member of your household has symptoms, the WHOLE HOUSEHOLD must isolate immediately and wait for the results of the PCR test/s. Please do not use Lateral Flow test kits for this purpose.

Please do not send your child in with a temperature or persistent cough. Please be aware of other symptoms detailed on the NHS and government websites.

Please do not send children in if adults in the household have symptoms, even if they have had a negative Lateral Flow test result.

Please do not send in siblings of children with symptoms, even if they have had a negative Lateral Flow test result. If a member of your household has a positive Lateral Flow Test, the WHOLE HOUSEHOLD/BUBBLE must isolate immediately and wait for the results of the follow up PCR test.

In addition, we have had a number of reports of children who are supposed to be isolating, being out and about in the community, playing in the park, visiting each other or staying over in other households. **Isolation means they have to stay at home at all times** unless they are going to seek a test or emergency medical care. Breaking isolation puts the whole community at risk.

Please continue to follow the mask-wearing and 2m social distancing rules on the school site and in the queue outside, and obey the instructions of the school staff controlling the crowds. Thank you for your cooperation.



Toys in school

Please remember that children are not allowed to bring toys from home into school. Lately there has been an increase in children bringing in plush toys, plastic jewellery and mostly the new pop-it fidget toys. Some children are permitted to have a sensory tool due to their Special Educational Needs, but this is by agreement with their teacher or the Inclusion team only. Any other toys being brought in will be removed, so please leave all toys at home.



Swimming

As you may know, the Kingfisher Swimming Pool was closed in 2019 due to structural problems. Kingston Council has now revealed plans to build a brand new leisure complex with pool to be completed by 2024. At King Athelstan we send all children in Y1-Y6 swimming for a term every year. With the closure of the Kingfisher pool, which was accessible to us on foot, we now have to pay to hire a coach to travel to the Malden Centre in New Malden. As a result, we are planning to take only one year group next year, most likely in the summer term. We will issue more information next year.

Bag 2 School

The PCSA has arranged for Bag 2School to collect on Wednesday 16th June. Bag 2 School is a company that specialises in the reuse and recycling of good quality second-hand clothing.
