We would like to say a big thank you to the Ernest Cook Trust, who donated £2000 to the school, allowing us to purchase new laptop trolleys. These enable storage and charging of our new DfE laptops so they are ready for use in class, or can be loaned out to isolating pupils who would not otherwise have access to technology.

Quality Mark

King Athelstan has recently received the Quality Mark



Award yet again. This national accreditation is awarded to schools which meet the Quality Mark Standard. The Quality Mark promotes, supports and celebrates progress and improvements made by a school in English and mathematics. Without these 'basic skills' of communication, children are disadvantaged throughout their lives - as learners, in the workplace and as parents, consumers and citizens. To achieve a Quality Mark, schools undergo an assessment against 'Elements' which cover key aspects of the school's improvement agenda, including identifying and analyzing the school's needs; good strategic planning; target setting for improvement; intervention and support for pupils underachieving or under-attaining; provision of quality in both teaching and in resources; staff development; and active engagement with families. Effective monitoring and evaluation are also required and we are very proud to have met the standards once again.






Sports Days 2021
