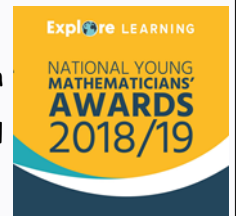

Pupil News

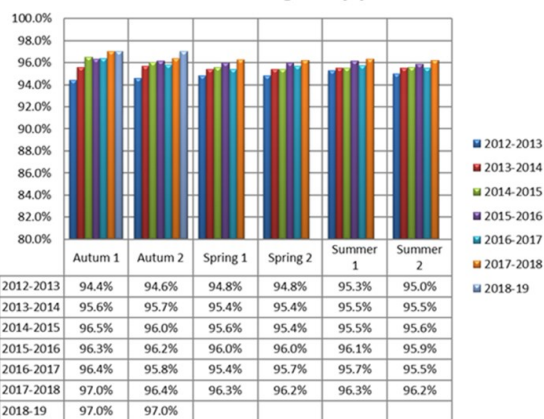

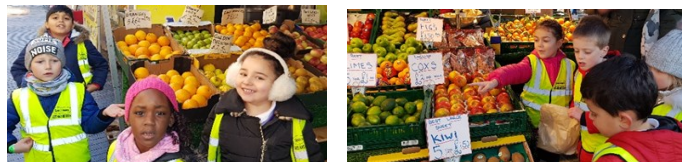

Lost Property

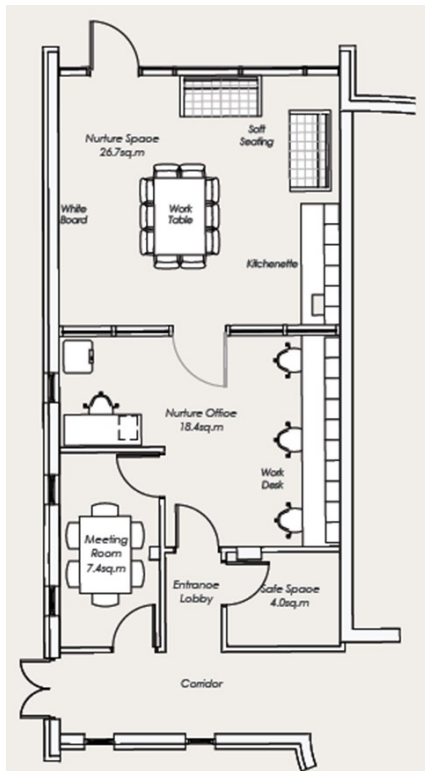

Building Works

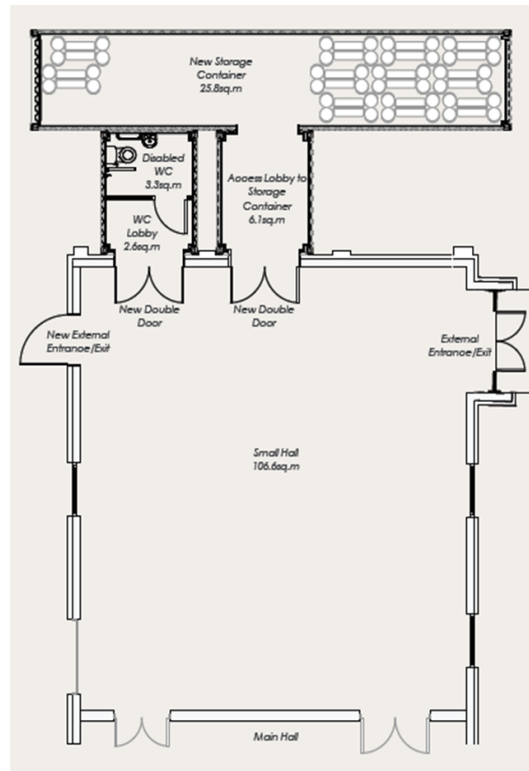
As you know, the Outdoor Learning Environment project is progressing and the meetings to explain the plans for the playgrounds to parents and carers were well-attended. Plans will be on display at the Summer Fair and in school next week. As well as the outdoor area, there are also plans to continue to improve the school buildings. These are four areas where work is planned and is currently being finalised by our architects:

1. Refurbishment of the existing "Hogsmill" KS2 toilets near the hall: the toilets will be extended and all sanitary ware will be replaced, with slab basins and urinal troughs installed which make good use of space and are more hygienic than individual basins and urinals. The doors at the sides will be closed off and new doors installed directly onto the playground. Outside water fountains will also be installed in the KS2 playgrounds.
2. The current Nurture/Inclusion Room will be remodelled into a Nurture Space, open-plan Nurture office, a Meeting Room and a Safe Space to enhance the current provision. See diagram below.
3. At the back of the small hall a container storage unit will be added to create a storage room with heat and light, which will accommodate the school's existing dining tables, along with stacked chairs. This new store will be accessed directly from the small hall via a small lobby. A second small area will connect to the small hall to provide WC facilities. This is to assist with the out-of-hours usage of the hall, ensuring that the hall can be hired out to third parties and remain isolated from the rest of the school. To further improve out-of-hours usage, a new external entrance/exit is proposed to allow for access to the small hall directly from the car park area. The poor acoustics in the small hall will also be addressed to improve teaching in this space. See diagrams below.
4. The Specialist Resource Provision will also open in the "Villa" (the grey demountable in the KS1 playground) in September 2019. This will be staffed by specialists and will provide additional expertise on the school site.

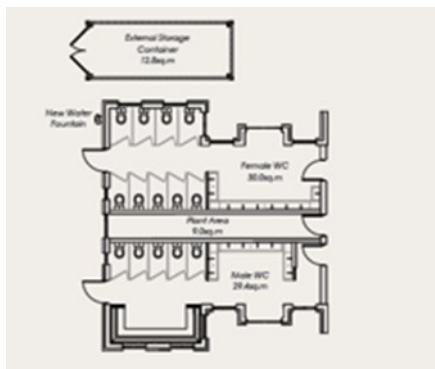
