

Phonics games to extend learning.

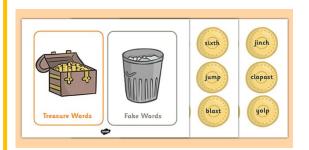
Hidden treasure

Ask your child make some golden coins or print some.

An adult then writes some green words on them and some alien words (words that are not real but can be sounded out).

Hide these around the house - send the children on a treasure hunt.

Your child then needs to read the words and put the treasure (green words) into his/her treasure chest.



Red word bingo – May require more than 2 players.

Ask the players to write down 6 red word (words that cannot be sounded out) that they know.

The lead player calls out some red words


First player to tick off all of their red words wins.

If there's a limited amount of players try this.

Write some red words on some paper – place them face down on the floor or a table.

Each player write down 6 red words

Take it in turns to pick up a word – tick it off it you have it.



Roll and read it word games.

Roll the dice and read the word it lands on.

You could roll two dice and have a vertical dice option too.

Have a go at making your own ones with green and red words.

Challenge: Look for stories with specific sounds. Can your child read the story and highlight all of the words with that sound? You could even try and write a simple story for them.

The sheep sat under the tree. On the tree hung a beehive full of lots of bees making sweet honey. The queen bee was a big bee and her job was to keep an eye on all of the other bees. The sheep didn't like the bees. They buzzed so loud that the sheep could not sleep.



Water Balloons.

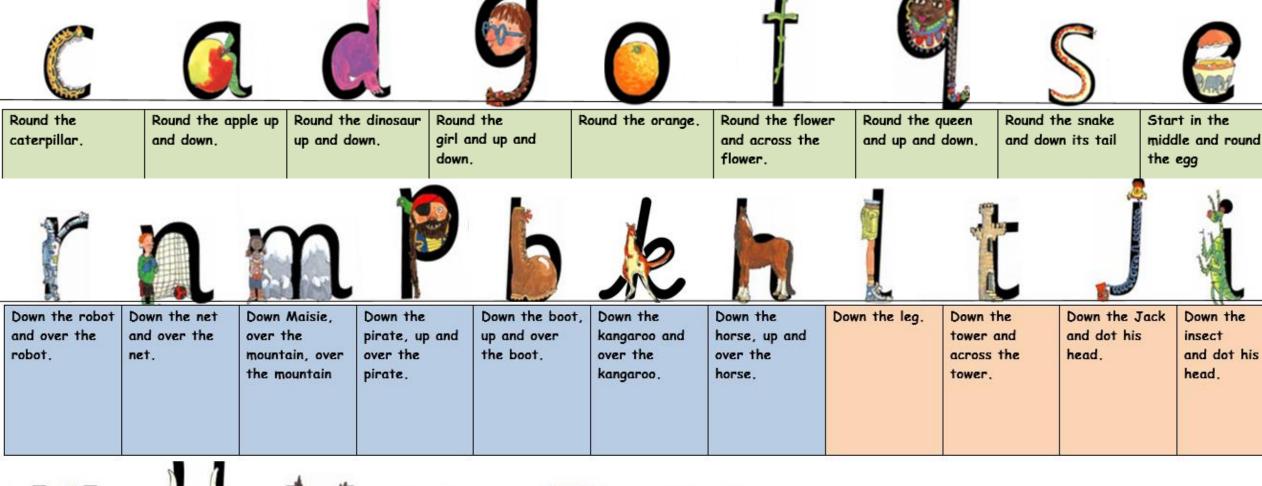
Fill up water balloons are write some diagraphs or triagraphs on them.

On the floor or on a wall begin to write a word - missing out a diagraph or triagraphs.

The aim is for your child to read the word and find the correct missing sound and throw the correct water balloon. If you do not have water balloons, you could just use chalk or paper and adapt the game accordingly.

- PVA school glue or craft glue
- Salt
- Food coloring (any color of choice)
- Water
- White card-stock or watercolor paper
- Template for your shapes

<u>Alternative:</u>

Substitute Water and Food Colouring for WATER BASED PAINT!

What you need to do:

- 1) Draw you picture
- 2) Trace whole picture or specific areas with glue
- 3) Add salt to glue let it dry
- 4) Add colour

Star Jump Challenge

Balancing Game

Create an area to work in (inside or outside).

On the word 'stop' you need to roll a dice or pick a number from a hat (put numbers 1-6 in a hat).

Whichever number the dice lands on/number selected from the hat is how many body parts you need balance on. For example, 4 means you will need to balance on 4 body parts.

Music Activity



Get musical with I am a Robot, Hands in the Air, Take You Home, Be in the Band, Bring the Noise and Spooky World.





Happy Superhero Day!

Who is your superhero?

To be a superhero you need to be:

Kind Brave Selfless
Patient Fun Loving

Craft something special for your superhero, to show how much you appreciate them.

Make Superhero 'toast hearts' for breakfast (If you have a heart pastry cutter) to say how much you love them.

Your Superhero is amazing and they love YOU!



Create your own superhero

You need: a toilet roll, a food packet, some coloured card and some glue.

- 1. Cut out a circle of card for the face and decorate using your superhero's favourite colour for the mask.
- 2. Cut out a length of packaging from your superhero's favourite food (pizza box, cereal packet, beer packaging. Make it the length of the toilet roll and glue.
- 3. Make a square out of card to fold around the back of the toilet roll to create a cape, and glue
- 4. Design and cut out a superhero badge (any shape) Glue to the front of your superhero

Why not make your whole Super family!

Make a superhero hand card.

- 1. Fold a piece of paper or thin card in half. It needs to be large enough for you to fit your hand on it.
- 2. Draw around your hand.
- 3. Cut out your hand only up to the fold (you might need adult help with this)
- 4. Decorate your superhero face with bits of wrapping paper/food packaging/felt tips...anything. If you don't have googlie eyes use buttons or bottle tops
- 5. Write a message inside for your superhero.



Art ACtivity

Printing with fruit, vegetables and objects from the recycling bin!


This week, why not have a go at creating pictures with fruit and vegetables? Try to use parts of the food that cant be eaten - the bits that you cut off before cooking. Get creative and try the techniques shown with a variety of foods. Or, alternatively, you could use old cotton reels, bottle tops, wheels from toy cars, leaves, bubble wrap, etc, to print and roll paint onto paper!
