







Spot the dangers - look at the pictures and discuss with a family member what is happening in each picture.

Draw a beach scene, look at all the different flags you might find at the beach and include them in your drawing.


This shows the lifeguarded area and is the safest place to swim and bodyboard




Danger! Never go in the water under any circumstances when the red flag is flying

When this flag is flying you should NOT go in the water








This flag shows an area for surfers, kayaks and other non powered craft. You should never swim or bodyboard here



Phonics games to extend learning.


Hidden treasure

Ask your child make some golden coins or print some.

An adult then writes some green words on them and some alien words (words that are not real but can be sounded out).

Hide these around the house - send the children on a treasure hunt.


Your child then needs to read the words and put the treasure (green words) into his/her treasure chest.



Spelling test!

Ask your adult to give you some words including red words to write down.
At the end, go through them with your adult and see how many you get right!

Don't forget to give it a big tick! <



Keep playing buried treasure game over the holidays- challenge yourself by choosing a higher phase!

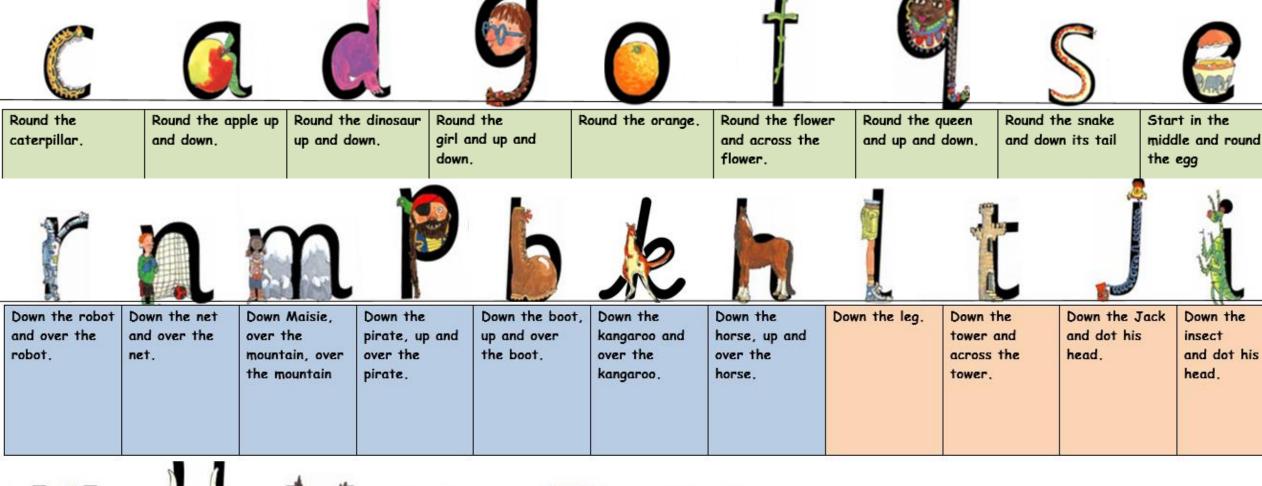




Nick had 8 apples yesterday but now half has been eaten. How many apples does Nick have now?
