<u>Returning to school</u>

We are really excited that the government have announced that in September we can all return to school. It will be a little bit different to normal but it will be fantastic to all be back together again. We can't wait to see you!

If you have been here during lockdown, the school will look similar. If you have not been in school, you will notice that there are arrows on the floor to help everyone know where to walk and there are signs to help everyone remember the rules.

As you know, we have an amazing plan for the KS1 playground. We will start raising money for this as soon as possible, so that we can make it as amazing as KS2.
