# Polite Reminders

### Sickness

Please help us to keep everyone fit and healthy and ready to learn by immediately reporting any diagnosis of Noro Virus to the office. We are required to monitor certain illnesses and report them to the local authority. Thank you. (Please note: we have had no diagnosed cases at our school).

#### Lost property:

All lost property is placed in the large plastic box on the infant playground. Please can you make sure you check it for lost items before the end of term. We will be sorting it out and giving things to charity during the Christmas holidays ready for a fresh start in the new year.

# School Entrances:

Please can you avoid stopping for chats near the school gates - there is a lot of congestion and, as a result of our increasing numbers, people are getting stuck in the bottle neck. Thank you for supporting us in easing the flow in and out of school!

#### Car Park Barrier

### Caterlink Taster Session

It was great to see so many of you at the Caterlink taster session. Thank you for your feedback. Caterlink are always striving to provide a good service and high quality meals for your children. ### Free School Meals (FSM)

Please remember that children are entitled to free school meals if the income for the household is less than £16,190 and you do not receive working tax credit. For more information speak to staff in the school office. All children who have had free school meals in the last six years are entitled to take part in an extra-curricular club for free. For more information please speak to the school office. Remember, if you are entitled to FSM you don't have to actually take up the meals however, by being registered, you will make a significant difference to the school budget as it triggers out Pupil Premium funding – nearly £900 per pupil. That makes a big difference to the opportunities/support we can offer!
