## Polite Reminders

Walking Home - If you would like your junior aged child to walk home alone, please complete a permission slip available from the office. Please remember that only secondary aged children can collect younger siblings.

Lunch Boxes - If your child has a packed lunch please can you make sure that he/she arrives at school with their lunch every day. A significant number of lunches are being dropped off later in the day disrupting the staff in the office. Thank you for your support!

Early Arrivals - We have noticed some unaccompanied children getting to school seriously early. As staff are in meetings and preparing for the school day we are unable to ensure these children's safety. Please be aware that we have a Breakfast Club available to support parents who need to get to work early. Pop into the office for more information.

Toys and Balls - We want your children to be happy at school - please do not let them bring in any toys or balls unless they have been asked to do so by a member of staff. Items from home can cause unnecessary worry they will be taken away and will need to be collected from Mrs Fairweather by an adult at the end of the school day. There are plenty of activities in school to keep the children busy - there is no need to bring anythin

### School Uniform

We really believe that smart children are in a better frame of mind for taking their learning seriously. It is lovely to see so many of the children looking so smart in their new uniforms. Please make sure your child is wearing black school shoes (not trainers or trainer-like shoes) and grey, black or white socks/tights. Please ensure that they have their shirts tucked in and that they are not wearing any nail varnish or earrings other than studs. To help prevent the spread of head lice we recommend that children with long hair have it tied back. Please support us with this.

Thank you for your patience when buying uniform from the school office - it has been very busy recently! From this week we will be having an allocated time for the office to sell school uniform - every Thursday afternoon from 2.30pm. Please ensure you submit a completed order form (available from the office) along with the correct payment - where possible - in a clearly named envelope.

#### PE Reminders

We want every child at King Athelstan to have healthy bodies with healthy brains! Help us keep your children active. Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school every day. All children need to have:

- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain black shorts
- Black plimsolls or trainers
- Stud earrings covered or removed

During cold weather some children may wish to bring in plain black tracksuit bottoms and a plain black sweatshirt.



### Extra Curricular Clubs

We are committed to giving the children experiences outside of the normal school day. We recognise that these activities give the children the chance to develop different skills and confidences. We are delighted to be able to offer a wide range of clubs this year - dance, football, tennis, drama, maths challenges and choir...to name a few. A letter has gone out recently. Can we remind you that we are charging £10 per child per term for each club that is run. These funds will help us to provide equipment to run clubs. If your child is Pupil Premium (have received a Free School Meal in the last 6 years) they are entitled to join one school club for free. Please see the school office for more information.





We recognise that children sometimes find school a little overwhelming for a number of reasons. We are delighted to be able to offer children additional support through our full time Nurture team - Denise Ramkissoon and Tracey Whooley. They have a varied role throughout the school, from learning mentors to small group nurture support. They work closely with class teachers and the senior leadership team to ensure every child is 'ready to learn' when they are in school. As part of their Nurture role they will be out in the playground every morning before school. Please feel free to have a chat with them if you have any worries or concerns about your child's school life.
