## Collecting children from school - a reminder of our policy

We expect that children from <u>Nursery to Year 4</u> are dropped off and collected from school by an *adult* (aged 16 or over) parent or carer. In order to begin to develop independence, Year 5 and 6 may walk to home from school by themselves *providing* the Google Form giving permission for this is filled in by their parent/carer. ## Bonfire Night - Keep safe!

Sparklers are often viewed as harmless but they do burn at fierce temperatures and can easily cause injuries to a young child. The heat from a sparkler is equivalent to the heat from a welding torch! So;

- Never give sparklers to very young children
- Make sure everyone handling sparklers wears gloves, preferably leather ones
- Hold sparklers at arm's length while being lit
- Don't wave sparklers about close to other people
- Never hold a baby in your arms while you are holding a sparkler
- When the sparkler has finished put it in a bucket of cold water
