Anti-Bullying Week

This week, all of the children at King Athelstan have taken part in the annual Anti-Bullying Awareness Week, led by Katrina Lee, Kusama class teacher and PSHE Lead. Throughout the week, the children have taken part in an assembly and PSHE lessons to help them understand bullying further and to support them in reporting bullying in school. At King Athelstan, we think it is important that children, staff and parents understand the features of bullying which include:

- It happening more than once, repeatedly over time
- It is deliberate, hurting someone on purpose not accidental
- It is unfair; the person(s) who bullies is stronger or more powerful (or there are more of them) and, even if they are enjoying it, the person they are bullying is not.

We believe that having an active approach to preventing bullying and responding quickly and effectively when it occurs will lead to less bullying and happier and safer pupils. We promote an ethos of care throughout the school. Central to this are our school rules and PRIDE values which are regularly revisited with children. Local and national anti-bullying resources are used to reinforce our anti-bullying message.

The theme of anti-bullying week this year was 'One Kind Word'. We focused our learning on the positivity that kind words can bring to the people around us and thought about the ways that we can help make our school an even kinder place. Below are some highlights of our week from each year group.

In Reception, we listened to stories about kindness and 'bucket filling'. We had lots of discussions about what makes a good friend and told each other

examples of when we have been kind and when someone has been kind to us. We then created some lovely pictures to show kindness and to represent when someone might fill our emotional buckets and when someone my dip into these buckets.










In Year 1, we printed off some buckets and spent some time making a mind map of kind actions to fill up people's buckets. Once they had completed their own mind maps in books, children drew a picture of themselves being kind to someone else. This afternoon the children are taking part in a bucket




dipping and filling sorting activity. Afterwards we will have a circle time celebrating all of our kind actions from this week.



In Year 2 we have been creating beautiful odd socks to celebrate our diversity and uniqueness. We are going to cut them out and hang them around our class

like a washing line to remind us to say kind words to each other.













In Year 4, Mehretu Class discussed the power of words. In groups, we filled up a bucket and then sorted some scenarios. After this, we drew our own buckets and listed ways to fill them, as well as ways people may dip into them. We finished by created our own origami buckets and began filling each other's buckets up.

Wiley class have been thinking about filling up buckets too. We have discussed the impact of words and actions, both kind and unkind. We have also linked this to our writing in English, thinking about how Quasimodo was treated in the novel 'The Hunchback of Notre-Dame'.










In Year 5, we looked at the video all about 1 kind word and what that means in relation to "filling buckets" and "dipping into buckets". We also looked at playing an anti-bullying board game with lots of different scenarios and then created our own one.







In Year 6, the children created their own kindness buckets using

origami. After making their kindness buckets, they then reflected on the importance of the bucket and how they will use it to spread kindness.
