Dear Families,

We welcomed prospective new families to our Virtual Open Morning this week for families new to King Athelstan or children eligible to start our Nursery or Reception classes in 2022. There is another one on 21^{st} October at 1.30pm. If you are aware of any families who might be eligible, please do let them know as 'word of mouth' is often the best recommendation! Last year 210 applications were received for 60 places so it is important that applications are made as soon as possible. For Y6 families don't forget that the closing date for applications for secondary school places in September 2022 is 31^{st} October 2021.

As well as a number of cases of COVID, we have also had many children in school who have unpleasant coughs and colds. With the complications with COVID, it is vital that children showing symptoms are tested - if a child is unwell they should not be in school. This allows the child a chance to recover and protects all in school. It is really important that everyone plays their part - by doing so our school will be able to 'Stay Safe and Stay Open':

- ✓ if your child is unwell with symptoms like fever, headache, cough or a change to their sense of taste or smell, they should not be in school and you should arrange a PCR test
- ✓ remember that 40-70% of children have no symptoms so the twice weekly rapid flow tests are so vital for your family. Test kits are available from the school office.
