eco friendly. In Monday's whole school assembly, Mrs Williamson told the children the story of the King Athelstan lockdown apple pip. During the March lockdown, Vida and a group of children in Reception planted an apple pip. Now look at it! What an amazing little seed! Mrs Williamson talked about how, even though the seed was small, it could do big things, just like Greta Thunberg in Sweden who, aged only 15, began a climate change movement which now encompasses the globe. Any small action we can take will help the planet.

Today has been our **Outdoor Super Learning Day** and we have all enjoyed our fantastic grounds by taking our learning outside. Classes have been involved in a wide range of activities including bulb planting, gardening in the allotment, outdoor treasure hunts, cave painting, pot making, creating



faces with natural objects and observational drawing. Some classes even took their maths and phonics outside!

During Outdoor Learning Day we challenged the children to make a promise to the planet, writing their pledge on a leaf. These leaves will displayed on Friday 5th November to create our own Forest of Promises reminding us how we can do all do our part, no matter how small.
