#### Dear Families.

This week we have been talking about our 'Butterfly Dreams'. At King Athelstan, we want children to be aspirational and set themselves challenging ambitions. We call these our Butterfly Dreams and link them to the poem below. On Monday, the children spoke in assembly about their dreams for the future and what they would like to achieve this year. In PSHE this week, the children then wrote down their dreams on butterfly cut outs which Ms Newton kindly made and delivered to us. These are now displayed in their classrooms.

Parents and carers should always let class teachers and school staff know if someone different is going to collect their child. 
#### Health & Medical Update
