COVID Update

As we enter the summer term and the final relaxation of the remaining COVID-19 restrictions, we wanted to inform you of the local and national guidance that we will be following in school:

- Children and adults who are unwell should stay at home until well enough to return to school. In particular, those with a high temperature must not attend school.
- If someone is experiencing **mild** symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough, they can attend school if otherwise well.
- Any children who have a positive COVID-19 result will be asked to stay at home for at least 3 days after the day they took the test for adults, 5 days is expected. After this they can return to school when well enough, provided they do not have a high temperature.
- School will continue to promote good hygiene and ventilation to reduce transmission.
- We encourage anyone eligible to have the COVID-19 vaccination and boosters to take up this offer. This has now been extended to children aged 5+. If you wish to book a vaccination or would like more information you may find the following links helpful:

Spotlight on Reading and Writing

The English curriculum at King Athelstan is all based around engaging picture books, thrilling novels and amazingly rich texts full of wonder, excitement and high-level vocabulary! At every level we develop our reading and writing skills, preparing us for our future learning, with reading in particular supporting our wellbeing and metal health.

Here is our writing progress display:



There is a piece of work from each class for the autumn term and the arrow points to their work in spring – the difference in quality is amazing! They have made so much progress since the beginning of the year.

Summer term in **Nursery and Reception** sees the children becoming so much more independent. They are more confident with reading and writing now, and so choose to do these activities more frequently, showing off the skills they have learnt.



In Year 1, we are really focusing on our phonics knowledge; we have finished learning new sounds from the Year 1 curriculum and have started recapping sounds already learnt in Reception and Year 1 so that

we are extra secure with both reading and writing these digraphs and trigraphs. We have even been putting our phonics skills to the test in our writing lessons too!





In Year 2, we are exploring the story 'Shark in the Dark' by Peter Bently. In the story the fish school together to create a giant whale to scare the shark – below you can see Hockney giving this a go before they wrote some instructions about how to do this as a team! The children have been writing letters and menus for the shark too.



In **Year 3** we have just finished reading The Worst Witch, by Jill Murphy. We LOVED this book and in the last few days we have been able to read it outside in the lovely weather! In English we are using WALL.E as a stimulus for writing which links to our topic of 'Do Machines Dream of Electric Sheep?'





Our topic in **Year 4** is 'Tales of the Barely Believable'. We are reading the book 'Don't Disappear' by Chelsea Clinton. This has inspired us to write about endangered animals. This term we are also excited about reading Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo!

In Year 5, we are reading Rooftoppers by Katherine Rundell - we have only just started the book and are very excited, as the first line of chapter 1 starts with: "On the morning of its first birthday, a baby was found floating in a cello case in the middle of the English Channel" - what a thrilling opening!



A special mention has to go to Francis in **Year 5** Warhol Class this week – she is the first child in the school this year to receive an *advanced pen licence*, which is a fountain pen – well done Francis!



Last term in **Year 6**, we learnt how to write holiday brochures - these were sent off to Audley Travel Agents, who were amazed by our 'turn of phrase' and ability to write with such purpose. The Audley team read all of the leaflets and voted for winners in each of these categories. There will be a video presentation for the winners and we will announce them in next week's Digest.
