Early Years



Children in early years have made an incredible step into the world of technology. Based on their story of the week, How to Hide a Lion at School, they have been taught how to use iPads, and then used Busy Things to create and decorate their own wild animals.



<u>Year One</u>

Linked with their topic 'All Creatures Great and Small', Year One have been dipping their toes into the complex world of coding and algorithms! Through simple code, the children have been using Jit Turtle to program animals to accomplish tasks using commands. Through this, the children learn how coding and programming works, whilst also gaining a deeper understanding of how to give detailed instructions. Watch out, parents and carers!

<u>Year Two</u>

As 'Brave Explorers' the Year Two classes have been investigating technology and how it integrates into the world around them. They have explored and described technology within the classroom as well as at home, with definitions such as "A camera sometimes takes priceless pictures!" Whilst exploring these wonders, the children have also delved deep into how to stay safe when using technology. A crucial skill!



<u>Year Three</u>



True to their topic name, the children have been using digital tools to show how they are indeed 'Wild at Heart'! The children have explored different African art and textiles and used Paint to create their own wonderful African-themed designs. As well as this, the children have been using Scratch to further their coding abilities.

<u>Year Four</u>

Year Four have been spinning more 'Tales of the Bearly Believeable' as they used Publisher to design and create their own leaflets informing readers about the rare spectacled bear - you may know one by the name of Paddington! The children have explored what it means to stand out and attract an audience whilst also informing and educating.

<u>Year Five</u>

Year Five have been exploring the 'Adventures of My Other Self' through their online personas. They have discovered what is meant by an avatar, and designed and created their own quizzes to test one another's knowledge.

<u>Year Six</u>

As their time at King Athelstan sadly comes to an end, Year Six children are creating their yearbooks themselves using various software. As well as this, they are going to amalgamate their skills learned across school to explore the wonderful world of Kai's Clan!

The programme offers completely free access for children receiving benefits-related Free School Meals to attend holiday clubs, sports groups, play sessions and more. Children who are entitled to the programme have the opportunity to attend up to 16 sessions throughout the summer.
