



Dear Families,

Well, life in school is never dull and always surprises us! Little did we know that we would be in the middle of navigating the school through an unprecedented heatwave, when we got the call from Ofsted to say we were being inspected this week. We are incredibly proud of your children and the staff team for showing our school as it always is: a happy family, always striving for excellence in everything that we do. Everyone showed how unbelievably resilient they are and so many of the children were involved in talking to the inspector, reading in front of her, or in being part of lessons that were being observed. Parents and carers rallied to provide a really clear response to Parent View. Your support was overwhelming - thank you so much. You can all view the outcome of the Parent View Survey [here](#).

As you may be aware, the current Ofsted framework is highly focussed on the breadth and progression of the school's curriculum and as a result, the inspector took a "deep dive" into a series of subjects during her visit. Ofsted take a few weeks to quality assure the outcome of the visit and we will inform families as soon as possible in the Autumn Term, as they will not send us the draft report until the new term. This was a Section 8 inspection which is about ratifying the school's own Self Evaluation.

Before we break up for the summer holidays, we wanted to update you on a number of changes in school. Many of you will be aware of the incredible challenge nationally with school funding. Our school has been able to set balanced budgets until the last couple of years, when we have had to draw on reserves to make ends meet. This is a national issue and most schools are already in a more challenging position than us. One of the key issues is the inadequate funding for schools, for pupils with SEND and significant rise in the "cost of living" (fuel bills etc), as well as staffing costs (we have a budget of £3 million and £2.5 million of that is staffing alone). There are many pressures on the budget and we hope to be able to get through this year, and possibly next, by drawing on very limited reserves before they run out. At the same time, we will be rethinking how we approach aspects of our work in order to "do more with less." Let's see this challenge as an opportunity to reflect and think about how we can do things differently moving forwards. I have been working with Governors over this term to think about the re-organisation of the Senior Leadership Team and other teams in our school to reduce costs over all. Our main aim is to maintain as much of the school's current provision as possible so that it does not directly impact on children. From September, we will be permanently reducing the Senior Leadership Team by 1 person and also reducing the Inclusion Team. We have carried out a number of internal recruitment rounds to redistribute responsibilities in order to manage the workload across the school. We will need to continue to rethink our approaches to further reduce the workload for individuals in the Autumn Term, and we will share our thinking around this in the new school year.

As a result of our reorganisation, we have made a number of internal appointments:

- Mrs Naomi Ahearn has been appointed as the Deputy Headteacher from September. We will not be replacing her current Assistant Head role.
- Miss Becks Parker has been appointed as the EYFS Lead. (Miss Kayleigh Lee has stepped back from this role as she is moving to teach Year 2.)
- Mr Stan Barson has been appointed as English Lead. (Mrs Ahearn has led English for many years but will not have to capacity to do this moving forwards.)
- Mrs Karen O'Connor will be moving from the Inclusion Team to support the wider SEND needs across the school in one of our phase teams.

We are also saying goodbye to some members of staff:

- Mrs Lucy Mastrocola, Deputy Head, is taking up Headship at Coombe Hill Junior School
- Mr Tom Channing, teacher of Wiley Class, is re-locating to Suffolk
- Mr Harry Moore, TA in Haring, is moving away
- Miss Sarah Cook, Receptionist, is going to work at Tiffin Girls' School
- Mrs Jackie Jordan is going to spend time looking after her grandson

- Miss Irimi Moutso is taking some time off before going back to study further
- Mrs Laura Davies is taking maternity leave

We wish them all well.

Today you will get you children's books. Please have a look at their very first piece of writing in their English books (Sept 2021) and then take a look at their latest pieces (July 2022). We think you will be really impressed with their progress!


