We have marked Black History Month by opening up conversations about the influences of our diverse

society in the UK, with a particular focus on the contributions of inspirational black people. In EYFS, teachers have been introducing talking about our cultural

differences and how we can celebrate and make the most of these, as well as what makes us the same as part of the human race.

Year 1 have looked at an inspirational footballer and written facts.

Year 2 have looked at black artists and shared their thoughts, as well as basing a lot of reading around them.




**Year 3** have explored 'Henry's Freedom Box' and have written freedom passes for the central character.
