Mrs Mastrocola's Weekly Digest Issue 16 – Friday 14th January 2022

Dear Families,

This week we have had a big focus on New Year habits and how it takes 21 days to make a habit. We have been thinking about how little things we do each day add up. In assembly on Tuesday, the children came up with some great ideas on what habits they would like to work on this year including: recycling one thing every day, reading for 20 minutes and giving someone a compliment, as well as taking part in the daily mile by running around our running track 7 and a half times each lunchtime. We also reminded ourselves of our 'Butterfly Dreams' which we set back in September and evaluated how the small targets we set for ourselves to achieve these aspirations were going. The children then discussed in class what actions they needed to take this term to help them achieve these goals. To help with this, over the next few weeks, children in Year 2-6 will be having one-to-one conferencing with their teacher and will be discussing their work and next steps.

Cold temperatures are set to continue into next week. Please ensure your child is suitably dressed for the school day, particularly for outdoor playtimes: coats, hat & gloves are essential. Please also take care on our footpaths around school.

Amazingly we are already half way through January - do enjoy a safe and happy weekend.

Please make sure that your child arrives on time at school every day. Timings are:

- Y1-Y6 arrival starts at 8.40am, with gates closing just before 8.55 am as children should be in class by this time. Pick up is between 3.10-3.20pm
- Nursery PM 12.30pm 3.30pm

Children arriving late may miss essential information at the start of the day, and it disturbs the whole class. Please make sure you let the office know if your child is sick or is not attending school for any reason.

Spotlight on Learning in Year 2

This week, Year 2 have started their topic 'Diary of a London Kid' which focuses on The Great Fire of London in 1666. A lot of us will remember the famous song 'London's Burning' from our time at school, and we continue this tradition in school today by singing to help us remember. We have delved into the amazing history of The Great Fire and discovered the first fire engines, dogs that look like kings and buried cheese (ask the children about that one). As our learning takes us to 17th century London, we uncover what it was like to live in such a bustling city; with no sewers, squashed houses and horses instead of cars - it could get quite smelly! We also discuss the Great Plague that occurred just before the fire and draw parallels with the pandemic we are living through today. In art, we are sketching out plans for London homes just like Sir Christopher Wren, while using these as plans for our future design technology lessons. This term's topic is 'on fire'!




Starting School

School Uniform

Please help us to keep standards of behaviour and pride in our school high by following these rules:

Shoes - these should be sensible, flat, completely black school shoes, not trainers or any other colour shoes (not canvas shoes, boots or heelies etc.);

PE Uniform – children should wear PE uniform on their PE days which is a **plain white** t-shirt, **black** jogging bottoms or shorts with trainers and the purple school sweatshirt;

Jewellery - Jewellery is not generally permitted, however, stud earrings may be worn if your child is able to remove them or cover them independently for PE. Religious jewellery is permitted;

Watches - may be worn, but must be sensible, and not have any alarm, etc. 'Smart' watches are not allowed; Nail Polish/Make Up - not to be worn in school. If a child has nail polish or make up on in school, they will be supported to remove it;

Hair -long hair (both girls and boys) should always be tied back with a plain hair band. No large JoJo bows or cats ears hairbands;
