Dear Families,

We have continued to discuss one of our school **PRIDE** values of 'Respect' this week. On Monday, the USA celebrated Martin Luther King Jr Day and we learnt about his inspirational 'I have a dream' speech. The whole school spotted Dr King on the Black History board and listened to Mr Barson (our History lead) tell the story all about his life. We talked about how he had the courage and belief to dream that something better was possible and then worked hard to achieve it. The children took this learning back into the classroom and decided on what dreams for the future world they might have and how they could inspire others to dream them with them.

Thankfully, Covid cases locally seem to be falling, although we continue to be notified of cases in school most days. Please keep doing all you can to be vigilant as this will ensure that we can keep school open and have the necessary staff in to do so. We have been giving out packs of lateral flow tests for families – please ask if you still require one. The guidance seems to be changing on a daily basis and the isolation rules did change last week. Collecting children from school – a reminder of our policy

We expect that children from <u>Nursery to Year 4</u> are dropped off and collected from school by an *adult* (i.e., aged 16 or over) parent or carer. Parents and carers should always let school staff know if someone different is going to collect their child. You can do this by emailing the office in advance or by 2.30pm on the day on: <u>messages@kingathelstan.rbksch.org</u>. We will not release children without prior consent. The children have really enjoyed sharing their treasures from home this week and we look forward to




seeing the rest as the weeks go on. Aside from all this amazing learning, we have also welcomed new children into

If you are not already aware of it, The Good Food Co-Op (TGFC) is a local, not-forprofit veg box scheme which aims to make healthy food accessible to all. Customers can order a small, medium or large box of spray-free veg, or fruit and veg, for delivery to home from just £4.75. The basic principle is that any profits from sales

of full price boxes go to subsidise prices for families who may not normally be able to spend on fruit and veg, and thus provides access to healthy food. This allows these families to access the boxes at a discount of 70%+. Take a look at their website on <u>www.goodfoodcoop.org.uk</u>

Once again Achieving for Children (AfC) will be financing the cost of free school meals with supermarket vouchers during school holidays:

February 2022 half term: 5 days, 14-18 February: £15.00 per FSM pupil

Easter 2022: 11 days, 1-19 April: £33.00 per FSM pupil

Did you know that if you are on a low income, or in receipt of benefits (except Working Tax Credit), you can check to see whether you are eligible for free school meals/funding via the LGfL Free School Meals Eligible Checker here: https://pps.lgfl.org.uk/

Please do check as this will benefit your child/children as well as the school. Thank you.


NHS Food Scanner App

Message from Kingston Council


