## Junior Roadwatch

The Junior Road Watch programme sees police work with small groups of pupils to educate motorists on the importance of road safety, especially near schools. You may have seen Y5 children out on Villiers Road on Tuesday, equipped with safety equipment and speed cameras set up outside school. They monitored the speed of vehicles travelling along Villiers Road, which is a designated 20 mph zone. Any drivers who were driving over this limit were stopped, and the police asked them to speak to the children instead of another enforcement activity. The children had been briefed and had planned some questions to ask. They also got the chance to sit in the police van and try

out the blue lights as well as helmets!

### Y3 Stone Age Activities

Recently, Year 3 travelled back in time to visit the Stone Age. They worked as a team to create a Stone Age stew containing various fruits. They learned how Stone Age people would have created the same stew all those years ago and how the tools and appliances used would have been different from ours. Later in the day



they focussed on cave paintings, talking about how they would often grind up different types of rocks and mix them with spit or animal fat to create a paint like paste. They would also have used animal blood, berries and charcoal to create their amazing cave paintings. The children then went outside to create a Year 3 cave painting of their own. Finally, they became hunter gatherers and had to search

for fruits around the playground. They identified some

difficulties Stone Age people may have faced, such as being chased by wild animals or eating plants that make us poorly. Luckily, we also talked about how some plants can be used as medicine and therefore most of our sick children were healed! They then had to travel to new land to find fresh food sources in order to survive. As you can see, they looked brilliant in their Stone Age costumes!



Y3 also tested their ability to survive the Stone Age in a workshop at Gunnersbury Park! First the children experienced an in-depth talk about this period of history and were able to handle real artefacts from the Stone Age. After this the children tested their aim by participating in spear throwing. Some of them even managed to spear a wild boar! Later, the children worked in teams to create Stone Age dens using branches, leaves and animal

skins. Finally, they practised using wattle and daub to create wind proof shelters with some very messy results! Many thanks to the parents and carers who accompanied us on this trip and made the hands-on experience possible.
