
NSUS DAY

School Census Day - 19 January 2023

School Census takes place on Thursday 19th January. The census collects a vast amount of details about our school including pupils' special educational needs, free school meals eligibility, as well as educational history. The school census is vital for helping education authorities determine what kinds of support a school needs, and helps ensure that the right funding goes to the right places, to support the right outcomes. We have a special lunch menu on this day, where children can build their own burger (either meat or vegetarian), followed by jelly and ice-cream. School Trips

All information about any school trip is sent to families by email, so please ensure school has the correct email addresses for you. We need your consent for children to go on trips (unless it is a local one, such as to the library), and this is done via ParentPay, where you also pay the cost of the trip, and log if you are able to volunteer to accompany the children. All helpers need to have a DBS check prior to volunteering, for safeguarding purposes. See the website here for information about volunteering and the DBS check. In ParentPay you will also see an item called 'voluntary overpayment'. Thank you to all those who have overpaid the cost of a trip/swimming in order to support other families who may struggle to pay; it is very much appreciated.

Exceptional Leave and Absence

We sometimes receive requests for children to leave school early for various reasons, including visiting family and parent's own medical appointments. We are only able to authorise a leave of absence if it is for a medical appointment for the child (proof will be required) or exceptional circumstances. Below is information about what exceptional circumstances are, how to apply for it, and what absences are authorised or unauthorised.

Exceptional Leave

- Parents/Carers requesting leave of absence from school for their child, should carefully consider the impact of the absence on their child's education. Missing out on lessons will always have a negative impact on a child's educational progress. It is widely understood that children make the best progress through regular and punctual school attendance.
- An <u>Application for Leave in Exceptional Circumstances Form</u> must be completed by the parent/carer in **advance** and returned to the school office.
- The Headteacher cannot grant leave of absence unless there are exceptional circumstances surrounding the application **and** an application has been made in advance.
- The Headteacher will consider each application individually including the specific facts, circumstances, and context behind the request.
- If the Headteacher is satisfied there are exceptional circumstances to authorise leave of absence, the Headteacher will determine the number of days a child can be authorised, considering the child's attainment, attendance, and ability to catch up on missed lessons.

Unauthorised Absences


- Family holidays are not considered exceptional circumstances, but unauthorised absence. This includes days of absence taken at the beginning or end of term for a family holiday.
- Birthdays/family days out are not reasons for absence. Children are expected to attend school as normal on their birthday. Family days out should be taken outside of school sessions.
- Illness, where a child is already Persistently Absence (under 90%) and medical evidence has not been provided, will be an unauthorised absence.

Medical Appointments

- We cannot authorise a child leaving early because of a parent's or sibling's medical appointment. Instead parents/carers should arrange for the sibling to be collected at the end of the school day by an emergency contact.
- If your child needs a medical appointment, every effort should be made to arrange it outside school hours to minimise the impact on your child's education. If a medical appointment has to be within the school day, your child will be expected to attend school before and after the appointment.
- Absence for a medical appointment can be authorised if evidence of the appointment is emailed to <u>admin@kingathelstan.rbksch.org</u> or is brought to the school office before the date of the appointment.

Repair Café - Repair Café Kingston is a community initiative, under the umbrella of Transition Town Kingston, promoting repair and skill-sharing as sustainable alternatives to throwing things away. Residents can bring their broken items to fix on the spot with the help of experienced volunteer repairers. All repairs and refreshments are free, though donations towards our costs are very welcome. The Repair Café will be in Kingston Library's community room on the first Saturday of every month, from 10.30am to 1.30pm, starting in February 2023.

Surbiton Warm Hub - In order to help fight the economic hardships and the energy crisis of the winter months, there will be a 'Warm Hub' at Surbiton High School Girls' **Prep** in January, February (and maybe beyond).
