

## **Parent/Carer** Consultations

This week teachers have been very busy meeting families online for their Parent/Carer Consultations online. Thank you to all who attended. Next week the Parent/Carer Consultations take place for children with SEND. These are in-person meetings with teachers in school. If you have not yet booked an appointment, please do so on: https://kingathelstan.parentseveningsystem.co.uk or speak to the school office for assistance.

As this half term includes both Neurodiversity Celebration Week and World Autism Acceptance Week (which we will be marking with children in our Inclusion Assemblies) the weekly Inclusion Bitesize images for both staff and families will relate to autism and other forms of neurodivergence. This week, a graphic showing the overlapping and contrasting characteristics of autism and ADHD. It is estimated that 30-80% of children with autism also meet the criteria for ADHD and that 20-50% of children with ADHD also meet the criteria for autism.

### Y2 Drama Workshop


