#### Dear Families.

In Tuesday's assembly this week we talked about the origins of Hallowe'en. I was really impressed with what the children remembered from the information we shared.

It was great to see so many families in for the SEND parent/carer evenings this week - thank you for your time and for working in close partnership with us to support your children.

Now the weather is cold and wet, please make sure your child has a <u>named</u> warm coat with them EVERY day. Please remember we cannot accommodate umbrellas in school – please take them back with you.

We have included some important information below regarding online safety as we are, again, dealing with increasing numbers of issues from children's use of phones outside of school, which spill into school because of the effect on children's wellbeing and interactions in school. Primary school children find it difficult to make judgements about what they post and also find it hard to think through the serious repercussions of their actions. Recent concerns range from unkind or bullying-type behaviour in messaging apps to posting things on public platforms and sharing personal details that could create significant safeguarding risk to individuals. We have also had concerns about children having hundreds of unknown 'followers' on social media platforms because their accounts are not private as well as children feeling frightened and intimidated in the middle of the night because they have phones in their bedrooms. Inappropriate and unkind messages are also often sent overnight when unsupervised.

# Online Safety

In today's digital age, ensuring the safety of our children online has become a paramount concern. We want to take this opportunity to address the age restrictions and safety considerations on popular social media platforms like Snapchat, Instagram, and TikTok, as well as the importance of being vigilant about "stranger danger" and the dangers of unknown followers.

Snapchat, Instagram, and TikTok each have age restrictions in place for users. Snapchat and TikTok, for instance, require users to be at least 13 years old to create an account, while Instagram has a minimum age requirement of 14. These restrictions are in place for a reason, as they align with the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA) guidelines and aim to protect children from online risks.

It is crucial to emphasise the dangers of interacting with unknown individuals online. Teach your child about the concept of "stranger danger" in the digital world. Emphasise that they should not engage with, accept friend or follower requests from, or share personal information with people they don't know in real life. Discuss the potential risks and consequences of such interactions, e.g not having interactions they would not have in person. Additionally, please consider the following steps to ensure your child's online safety:

- Open Communication: Maintain an open and ongoing dialogue with your child about their online activities. Encourage them to talk to you if they ever encounter anything that makes them uncomfortable, especially interactions with unknown individuals.
- Privacy Settings: Set appropriate privacy settings on their accounts to limit who can see their content.
- Supervision: Supervise their online activities and have them use the platforms in a communal area.
- Cyberbullying Awareness: Discuss the issue of cyberbullying with your child and educate them on how to handle such situations, including blocking or reporting users.
- Time Management: Encourage healthy screen time habits and balance between online and offline activities.
- Model Behaviour: Be a positive role model by demonstrating responsible and respectful online behaviour and screen time habits.
- Check your child's device daily and ensure they do not have it overnight.





By working together, we can help children navigate the online world safely and responsibly while being vigilant about the dangers of unknown followers.
