Have a lovely, relaxing break over Christmas, and a happy and healthy New Year from the whole staff team. Thank you all for your support throughout 2023.



Year 1 Design & Technology


From Ms Hosseinian, D&T Lead:

What fantastic D&T sessions Y1 have had this term! Our project was to create a room and we dedicated an entire week to fully



immerse ourselves in understanding and executing all the important D&T steps necessary to achieving excellence. We started off by doing some research on what would make
