

King Athelstan Weekly Digest Issue 16 - Friday 12th January 2024

Dear Families,

Welcome back and Happy New Year to everyone in our King Athelstan community. We hope you have had a relaxing break.

It has been a cold but positive start to the spring term. Thank you for ensuring your children have warm coats, hats and gloves. Over the holidays we have had some grounds work done as the next phase of development for the KS2 wild area. There is now a new path that will eventually facilitate access to this area. There is still more work to be done before it is operational. We have also had some other areas tidied up (e.g. along the path on the way to EYFS) and some fencing has been replaced.

Please keep an eye on your inboxes for information about upcoming trips and visits for your child's class for this term and make sure you have a note of your child's class assembly, if it has not yet happened this year. We publish dates on the school website here.

In assembly at the end of last year we were talking about spreading kindness and happiness by doing kind things for others and making an effort to greet people and talk to children or adults in school that you don't yet know well. It would be great to continue this within our parent/carer community. We have had quite a few new families start in Nursery and across the school. Please do extend a warm welcome to anyone new and try to make some new connections with parents/carers you don't know yet.

One final reminder - we are still really struggling with parents/carers coming in to wait at the EYFS and KS1 gates before drop off or collection times. PLEASE wait outside until your gate opens. Nursery families should be first in the mornings at 8.30am, with everyone else waiting in the queue outside. Coming in early creates extra 'traffic' in a very busy area, making it hard for people to get through to drop off or collect their children and slows down people leaving the school site , which then slows everything further. Please also avoid gathering in the entrance area and by the gates to chat or to 'unload' children/bags from buggies as this blocks access for everyone else. Children working in the KS1 playground or in neighbouring classrooms find it very difficult to learn effectively or complete their daily routines with additional people watching them while waiting at the end of the day. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

KS1 Playground Refurbishment

We are delighted to announce that work on the KS1 playground will begin on Monday 29th January. After our consultation with staff and families, we have selected the Fawns design. The company will complete the first phase of the design this term (see diagram), with plans to continue fundraising for the second phase already in place. At present Fawns are suggesting a 3-4 week schedule, one week of which falls in the half term holiday. The building work will have implications for pickup and playtime arrangements. Heras fencing will be erected around



the whole grass area of the KS1 playground which will restrict the flow of families coming into the playground at pickup time. We will be asking everyone to adhere to the one-way system walking into the KS1 playground through the double gates by Haring and Wiltshire (Nurture/Inclusion) and then continuing out of the playground via the large gates into the car park.

We will share full details of these arrangements in the next few weeks. A massive thank you and well done to our PCSA team who have worked relentlessly over the last few years fundraising for the Big Outdoors Project. Without their unwavering support and the generosity of our families, staff and all those who have raised funds, the Big Outdoors Project would not be happening. We are all very excited to finally be able to give our KS1 children the playground they deserve! Once this phase has been built, we need to raise approximately £70k for Phase 2 to complete it, so please keep up the fundraising!

School Census

Next Thursday 18th January is school census day. The school census takes place three times a year and collects information such as pupils' background details, special educational needs, free school meals eligibility, as well as educational history. It also collects data on absence, exclusions and their reasons, indicators of armed forces or



children in care. <u>Our school funding is based partly on how many children have a school</u> <u>lunch on census day so we ask that you make sure you book a meal on this day.</u> It would make a huge difference to us if everyone booked a meal on this day. The menu for next Thursday is chicken burger or a cheese and tomato pizza, so **please make your booking on ParentPay in the usual way**. Thank you.

Maths KIRFs

KIRF (Key Instant Recall Facts) have been designed to support the development of the mental skills that underpin much of the maths work in schools. This is part of a national drive to improve mental maths. Every half term, each year group will have a focus and by the end of each half term, children should know those facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts instantly. It is expected that the children will learn and practise these in school AND at home. All the KIRFs are on the school website. 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Outdoor PE Lessons

A message from Mr McLaughlin: As a rule, children do not wear jackets or coats in PE lessons as it restricts their movement. They are very active in these lessons so would normally warm up quickly. However, exception is made if they have a cold/cough or are recovering from a cold/cough or other viral infection. In this instance a jacket will be allowed. Exception is also made should a child request to wear a jacket/coat or other items such as a beanie or gloves, within reason. In extreme weather, all children may be asked to wear coats in the warm up. The welfare of the children is paramount so please do reassure that they can request to wear any of these items.

Coronation Artwork



We are really pleased to display our final piece of artwork which was made to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III on 6th May 2023. Each of the children drew one of the four national flowers from the countries of the United Kingdom using oil pastels. Mrs Barr then organised them into the shape of the crown and Dariusz, one of our site managers, created a Perspex front and frame for it. It took 2 people and a complex arrangement of props and supports to hang it. It is enormous (8 feet high and 4 feet wide) and displayed in our large hall, so take a look next time you are in school. It looks really wonderful. Special thanks to Mrs Barr, our Art Teacher, for managing all the arrangements to accomplish it.
