Specialist Resource Provision (Haring) Update

As you are aware, for the past 5 years, the school has run a Specialist Resource Provision (SRP) for children with EHCPs whose main presenting need is Social Emotional Mental Health (SEMH). Please see below a message from AfC (local authority) regarding this provision.

From September 2024, the specialist resource provision (SRP) at King Athelstan School will pause, while the local area re-assesses its offer for primary aged children who have social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) needs. This is part of the wider Alternative Provision/ SEMH strategy which is being taken forward to consider our local offer across mainstream and targeted support, and in light of the London River SEMH Special School, which is due to open in September 2025. Managing successful transition for the three children currently in the provision will be a priority for the SRP team and SEN over the next few months.

Many children and their families have benefited from the provision at the school, and from the expertise and commitment of the staff team, and we are extremely grateful to the SRP team and King Athelstan for leading the provision. We are committed to retaining their skills in the borough.




Nursery Applications for September 2024
