## Gardening Volunteering Opportunity

Just a reminder that we have an opportunity for one or more volunteers who are able to support our pupils tending our flourishing allotment. The role would be from 1pm to 3pm on Mondays during term time and would suit



someone who has a little knowledge of gardening or just lots of enthusiasm for the outdoors. Three groups of ten children visit the allotment each week (30 in total for an afternoon) and take part in activities such as weeding, planting, seeding, harvesting and watering. ## Childcare for School Meetings

We really appreciate your engagement as parents/carers with us at school so we can work together to support your children as effectively as possible. **We try hard to give advanced notice of meetings, wherever possible, and request that you use this time to make suitable arrangements for your children to be cared for during these meetings.** Whilst we can occasionally accommodate supervising one or two children for a short period during an unexpected and urgent meeting (e.g. a discussion after school about an incident that has occurred during that day), we are unable to routinely provide childcare for larger numbers of children (e.g. during parent/carer consultations) or for longer meetings. We are seeing an increase in families expecting this type of support at a time when our resources are increasingly stretched. It can be helpful to make agreements with other families to supervise each other's children during any meetings. For example, as many meetings will occur after school, you may find that another parent is willing to supervise your child, e.g. in the park, until you can pick them up when you are finished. We are also happy, in many cases, to meet virtually if this supports your childcare arrangements. Thank you for your understanding.

## Medicines in School

If your child requires short term medication, such as antibiotics, the school will be able to administer it if it is required 4 or more times per day. In this case, please complete the form [here](#). We can only give medication in school within the instructions detailed in this form. If the medication is required 3 times per day or less, parents/carers will need to administer it outside of school time. For further information please see our [Medicines Policy](#).

## Attendance

We have recently sent out emails letting families know about their child's attendance levels so far for this half term. For the majority of families this is purely for your information. If your child's attendance is less than 90% our Welfare and Attendance Officer, Ms Natali O'Farrell, will contact you in the coming weeks to look at ways to support your child's attendance going forward. At this point in the year, we know that a significant illness, such as chicken pox, may bring your child's attendance down considerably and we will take this into consideration. The progress of each child at King



Athelstan is central to our school ethos. Being in school and having the best attendance possible underpins a child's education, their learning, wellbeing and wider development. Regular attendance is essential to ensure a child's uninterrupted progress and to enable them to achieve their potential. All children should be able to take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them by law. As a school, we expect all children to attend every day as long as they are fit and healthy enough to do so. A child's attendance should be at least 96% across the year. Anything below 90% is considered 'Persistent Absence' and means that the child is missing a considerable amount of their education.

Next week, 11<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> November, is Anti-Bullying week and the theme is 'Choose Respect'. We will be doing a special assembly and classes will participate in a range of activities over the course of the week.


## Community Messages
