Reading every day is one of the simplest and most powerful ways to support your child's learning. Those small, consistent moments truly add up. Children cannot make good progress in reading by only practising in school! Thank you for continuing to make reading a valued part of your child's daily routine. Your support at home has a profound impact.
